






Non-recurring COVID-19 Relief Funding Awards & Expenditures as of June 30, 2021 (in thousands)






Bloomfield Hills Schools General Fund Revenue and Other Sources Year Ended June 30, 2021




Bloomfield Hills Schools General Fund Expenditures and Other Uses – By Function Year Ended June 30, 2021





We will determine low-impact vs. high-impact transitions and review catchment areas every 3-5 years.

We are committed to equal-sized enrollment at all 4 elementary and 2 middle schools that reflect equitable demographics with proximity to neighborhood schools.

Process Overview

- Currently, two Bloomfield middle schools house grades 4 through 8, and one middle school houses grades 5 through 8.
- Our Scope & Design Process Outcome: By fall of 2023, there will still be four elementary schools, and all will serve Kindergarten through grade 5, and the two middle schools, named "North Hills" and "South Hills," will serve students in grades 6 through 8.
- The North campus will be located where Lahser High School once stood, and the South campus will stand at the current Bloomfield Hills Middle School.

Legacy Guidelines & Transition Planning

Legacy Transfer Requests

- Requests to Stay at Former School: This option is only available for residents living within the impacted neighborhoods that will have children in grades 1-5 starting the fall of 2023
 - Or, is a younger sibling of a student that has selected the Legacy Transfer Option and will be attending elementary school at least one year at the same time as their sibling. For example: A kindergarten student in the fall of 2023 has a older sibling that will be in 2nd grade would be eligible for this option.
 - A Legacy Transfer Request ends after 5th grade and students will attend their neighborhood middle school in grades 6-8.
- Requests to Transfer Early: In the fall of 2022, this option is available for residents living within the impacted neighborhoods that would like to transfer early to their newly assigned elementary school.
 - Space might be limited and requests will be taken in order received.

Important Notes for Planning


- Making a Plan for Transportation: Families choosing to Request a Legacy Transfer will need to make plans for providing their own transportation
- **Cohorting Students:** Families will have the opportunity to initiate student placement requests with familiar faces and neighborhood friends / while not all requests can be granted, this family input will be given strong consideration for those families joining a new school community provide
- Designing Welcome Plans: Building leadership and PTO's will be asked to help support and empowered to design transition/welcome plans for new families


